<p><b>Introductions &amp; Announcements</b></p>	<p>Kanabec County Sheriff’s Office March Stats (DUI, Drugs, etc.)</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Graduation parties coming up – possible for more offenses</li> <li>• It was inquired if SACK would be putting something in this year’s graduation programs at the high schools.</li> <li>• Compliance Checks were held on April 21, 2017. There were 21 establishments which had compliance checks and there were 3 failures. All three establishments were charged with gross misdemeanors.</li> <li>• Members questioned if the Sunday liquor sales will be available in city and county establishments. Barb McFadden will look into the statutes to find out if the county and city need to allow Sunday liquor sales.</li> <li>• Special event licenses are available and SACK will provide RBST training for those events.
