Members received a hand out with the end of year statistics and a copy will be mailed to members at their request. Statistics include: caseload numbers, number of search warrants saved, drug arrests and non-drug arrests and types of drug seizures and weapons seized. The statistics show that: (1) meth is the number one problem in relation to amounts; (2) heroin and opioids are more dangerous because the drugs are killing more people quickly than meth. • The amount of weapons seized was down. • There were sixteen presentations. • Members were shown a press release regarding the statistics mentioned in the report. • There was discussing regarding the legalization of marijuana in Minnesota and the need to educate the public of the ramifications of the legalization. <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ○ Discussion regarding educating the public regarding legalization of marijuana and how it can have adverse effects to the community. It would be a great idea to start the conversation now before legalization happens. More conversations with youth.
